3.2 Philosophy

"Innovation" refers to something newly invented, which can be technology, ideas, or products. It consists of 3 key dimensions: 1) It is new or improved from the original; 2) It has economic benefit and can add positive value; 3) It uses knowledge and creativity as a base. Therefore, "Innovation for Human and Social Development" means creating concepts and processes for social development using new tools and methods necessary for development work. It is multidisciplinary, integrating knowledge such as contemporary community development, CSR, social enterprise, and volunteer management

3.3 Curriculum Objectives

Graduates will have the following characteristics:

1. Knowledge and understanding of innovation for human and social development; able to think, analyze, synthesize, and create development concepts suitable for real situations
2. Leadership skills in seeking knowledge, holistic worldview, and creating knowledge through Integrative Research and Development (IR&D); leadership in volunteerism and social innovation for social change
3. Ethics, morals, creativity, outside-the-box integration, social responsibility, volunteer participation, and upholding peace

Course Descriptions

1) General Education Courses (Selected Examples)

- **TU101 Thailand, ASEAN, and the World:** Study of significant phenomena in political, economic, and sociocultural dimensions using social science research frameworks to build a global mindset.
- **TU109 Innovation and Entrepreneurial Mindset:** Risk assessment, creating opportunities, entrepreneurial planning, decision making, and social shared value creation.
- **TU121 Human, Societies and Cultures:** Introduction to understanding humans from social/cultural perspectives, social institutions, and analyzing contemporary issues.
- **TU100 Civic Engagement:** Instillation of social conscience and awareness of roles as good global citizens through campaigning or changing areas of interest.

2) Specific Courses

2.1) Fundamental Courses

- **PCD201 Organization and Management for Sustainability:** Fundamentals of organization, management processes (planning, staffing, controlling), leadership, ethics, CSR, strategic management, and sustainability management concepts applied to various organizations (NGOs, public, private, social enterprises).
- **PCD202 Basic Communitology and Sociology:** Concepts and theories regarding the truth of community, culture, and society; their characteristics, goals, and preservation processes.
- **PCD203 Political Economy and Social Development:** Structural analysis of society considering economic, political, legal, and cultural contexts affecting development; relationship between economic changes and other sectors.

- **PCD204 Aesthetics of Development:** Concepts of beauty, value, and human satisfaction in arts, inventions, and development products; criteria for aesthetic judgment leading to happiness and goodness.
- **PCD205 Introduction to Development Studies:** Key concepts in development studies, poverty causes, inequality, role of health/education, credit markets, national income growth, and contemporary issues like migration and globalization.
- **PCD206 Innovative Concepts and Critical Thinking:** Definition of innovation, innovator skills, critical thinking theories, cognitive processes integrated with creativity and problem-solving for 21st-century needs.
- **PCD208 Introduction to Statistics and Data Analysis:** Basic statistics, quantitative/qualitative analysis principles, using statistics for research, computer programs for analysis, and data presentation.
- **PCD301 Research Methodology for Social Sciences:** Importance of research in life and social development; relationship between knowledge-research-development; quantitative and qualitative research processes.
- **PCD302 Project Management for Social Impact:** Concepts/theories of development projects; design, monitoring, management, and evaluation tools for complex situations.
- **PCD303 Introduction to Social Impact Assessment:** Study of social impact assessment from investments; learning from public/private investment cases affecting communities.

2.2) Core Courses

- **PCD207 Design Thinking for Development:** Human-centered thinking process to understand problems deeply; using creativity and diverse perspectives to prototype and test solutions/innovations.
- **PCD211 Contemporary Community Development:** Theories of community and development paradigms; rural-urban transformation problems in Thailand/region; community development in the 21st century.

- **PCD221 Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR):** Meaning, types, and importance of CSR; related theories; domestic/international case studies; Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and CSR.
- **PCD231 Introduction to Social Enterprise:** Development and meaning of social entrepreneurship; global movements; ecosystems for social enterprise; case studies on business models, social impact, and management.
- **PCD241 Volunteerism for Human and Social Development:** Volunteer paradigms/ideologies; theories on volunteering conditions; case studies; value of volunteering; writing volunteer projects; policy trends.
- **PCD422 Sustainable Report and Management:** Meaning/importance of sustainability reports; preparation process per international standards (e.g., GRI); case analysis; applying reports for management.

2.3) Required Elective Courses

- **PCD304 Social Innovation for Development:** Concepts, characteristics, and patterns of social innovation as a foundation for solving social problems (includes field visits/practice).
- **PCD305 Skills for Social Change:** Concepts, tools, and techniques for "Direct action" to create fair social change in economic/social/environmental dimensions; individual/group movements.
- **PCD306 Psychology for Social Development:** Psychological principles of individuals/groups related to perception, thought, behavior; group/community processes; social influence; creating alliances/networks.
- **PCD311 Management of Community Economy System:** Self-reliance concepts; managing human/social/physical capital; Sufficiency Economy Philosophy; community enterprise success/failure; simulation games.
- **PCD321 Strategic CSR Management:** Strategic management; strategic CSR; planning CSR to meet corporate strategies; risk management; stakeholder management.

- **PCD331 Social Marketing:** Marketing theories/consumer behavior; marketing for CSR/Social Enterprises; analysis of success/failure in advertising; creative marketing plans.
- **PCD341 Volunteer Management:** Meaning of volunteers; global/Thai situations; management problems; guidelines for managing volunteers in various organizations efficiently.
- **PCD351 Population Dynamics and Development:** Demographic transition; fertility/mortality/migration theories; interaction between demographics and economic/social factors; aging society issues.
- **PCD352 Urban Economy and Society:** Concepts of city changes; rural-urban links; environment; urban problems; lifestyles of diverse urban groups.

- **PCD491 Seminar and Field Study Trip in Innovations for Human and Social Development:** Seminar and field visits to learn techniques from organizations/speakers; gaining experience for internship preparation.
- **PCD492 Co-operative Education:** Practical work experience in organizations (min 16 weeks); applying theory to practice; employee-like work.
- **PCD493 Field Practicum:** Working in human/social development organizations using innovation suitable for the 21st century (min 270 hours).
- **PCD494 Senior Thesis in Innovations for Human and Social Development:** Presentation of a thesis or creative work.

- **PCD421 Strategic Human Resource Management:** Strategic HRM; job design/analysis; recruitment; training; performance appraisal; compensation.
- **PCD423 Good Governance Sustainable:** Concepts of good governance; sustainability dimension; stakeholder relations; driving governance in public/private sectors.
- **PCD424 Conflict Management and Peace Studies:** Concepts of conflict/peace; human rights; creative conflict management at various levels.
- **PCD431 Social Enterprises Business Plan:** Designing and creating a social enterprise business plan under advisor supervision.
- **PCD441 Laws and Policy for Thai Volunteers:** Laws/policies regarding volunteers, social welfare, and government policies.
